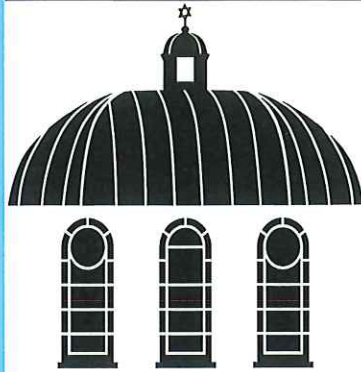

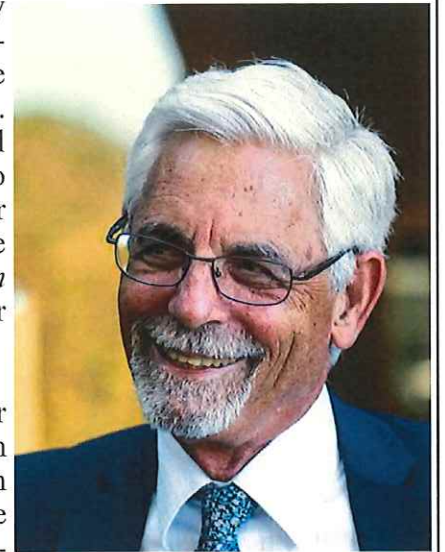

FROM OUR TEMPLE RABBI

Tikkun Olam: It's More Than A Tax Deduction

Every year, through the month of December, my mailbox is filled with requests for end-of-the-fiscal-year appeals. Letters and flyers come from Jewish and non-Jewish organizations. They focus on local, national and international causes. Each organization tries to respond to the myriad needs that present themselves in our world. The goal of these various groups (be they Jewish or not) is what we call *Tikkun Olam* – the concept of repairing the brokenness of our world.

But in our complex world, how can our “monetary gift” make a difference? How can we really help to “repair the brokenness” when our concern or awareness is limited to one month out of the entire year? Is our sole motivation to participate in *Tikkun Olam* based on the incentive of a tax deduction? Are we oblivious to these needs come the new calendar year? Hopefully, we recognize that *Tikkun Olam* is NOT just a concept, but rather a sacred obligation that we, as citizens of the world, must take seriously.



Tikkun Olam is more than just writing a check...it is a way of thinking and living that is unselfish.

Tikkun Olam means having a conscious awareness of those around us and working to insure that every human being, every person who is created in God's image, is viewed and treated with dignity.

Tikkun Olam means that we, as individuals and as a community, are ready and willing to respond to the real, basic needs of others.

Our prophetic tradition reminds us that we cannot and must not turn away from and ignore the plight of others; rather we must stand up and speak out on behalf of those who have no voice.

My colleague, Rabbi Gerald Wolpe tells the following story:

Someone once cried to God: Adonai, the world is in such a mess – everything seems wrong. Why don't You send someone to help and change the world?

The voice of Adonai replied: I did send someone. I sent you!

We pray for life – we ask God for a year of health and happiness. We cannot merely ask. Tell the Almighty – tell the world – tell yourself: Send Me! *Hineni sh'laheni! Here I am, send me!* (Isaiah 6:8).

FROM OUR TEMPLE PRESIDENT

Temple Emanuel's Trio of Ingredients (Flexibility, Spirituality & Audacious Hospitality)

Happy New Year Temple Emanuel. Can you believe it is 2020!!! I wish for everyone a Healthy, Happy New Year..

I had the distinct honor, as your Temple President, to represent Temple Emanuel at such an impressive gathering of 5000+ Jews from North America and beyond. The URJ Biennial was held in Chicago in December and it is an experience that everyone should have at least once in his or her lifetime.

The focus of this Biennial was very different as compared to previous years. The issues of social action/social justice as well as inclusion could be seen everywhere. These timely topics were interwoven into the educational sessions, plenaries and late night entertainment. Inclusion was the hot topic and the URJ seemed to have all the bases covered.



I attended plenaries led by URJ President Rick Jacobs that talked about ways to include the "Jewish Adjacent" which was a new buzz word along with "Ashkenormative". He reviewed the implementation of the URJ's 2020 Vision, a bold and ambitious plan that focused on the three core principles: Strengthening Congregations, Audacious Hospitality and *Tikkun Olam* (Social Justice). We learned that the number of Reform Jews, although the largest segment of Jews in North America, is decreasing; we as a movement are a more intense. We can no longer focus on the Jewish elitism or as Rabbi Jacobs referred to it the "Ashkenormative" (white, Jewish person with lineage from Europe or Russia). We need to figure out how to adapt and use our sacred text to widen our tent. We discussed ways to better include the Jewish Adjacent (usually made up of an interfaith marriage of which 71% of non-orthodox Jewish marriages are considered Jewish Adjacent), the LBGTQIA (lesbian, bisexual, gay, transgender, queer, intersex, and asexual) community, the Jew of Color and the disabled.

I also learned that Baby Boomers (those born between 1944 and 1964) out numbered Millennials (those born between 1980 and 1994) this year. However the Millennials will be the future of Reform Judaism.

So why do I share this message with you? It is felt that synagogue models as we know them will fade away. In order to maintain longevity we need to constantly assess and reassess. Where is Temple Emanuel along the ever changing Jewish paradigm? That is a question for leadership as well as the congregation. In order for us to survive and even thrive we need to focus on some tough questions. **That is why I asked that we have a town hall meeting on January 9, 2020 so we can start the dialogue of these and many more thought provoking questions.**
