



# STAYING CONNECTED

As I sit alone in my study at home composing this bulletin article, I keep thinking aloud: we are living through an unprecedented event in our lifetime. The pandemic of COVID-19 has quantitatively and qualitatively altered how we go about daily living. Every day brings new information, new procedures, new directives and more questions. Each of us is faced with making decisions about our health, the health of our family and our community. It is a scary and frightening time. No



one knows how long this world-wide crisis will last. No one knows what other measures must be taken in order to gain control over the spread of this virus.

The human fears of isolation and even death have gripped our nation. As a result, "panic buying" of groceries and other household supplies is evident. The economic impact and fallout will be with us for years to come. The psychological toll on individuals, families and our society in general is yet to be determined. These are some of the human challenges we face in response to the coronavirus. As we struggle to "flatten-the-curve" and slow the spread of COVID-19, we must act responsibly. Each of us must answer for ourselves some vital questions like: to what extent do you take care of yourself and your family versus society? ## EXCERPT from Rabbi Michaels' message to his Temple Emanuel Family mailed earlier in March:

These are very difficult and trying times in our community, our nation and our world as a result of the progression of COVID-19. We depend upon accurate information and medical expertise to advise us on best practices to staying safe as we respond to this pandemic. The Temple leadership shares your concerns and stand ready to respond in ways that protect your physical health while continuing to be present for your continued emotional and spiritual health.

With this in mind, the Temple Emanuel Board of Trustees has suspended all activities (as of March 19, 2020) at Temple Emanuel properties. Friday evening services, Shabbat morning Torah study, on-site meetings and activities will not take place until further notice and it is deemed appropriate to resume. The leadership is working to provide virtual alternatives for the membership: streaming of services, Torah study; conducting meetings via a virtual platform, etc. We will of course keep you updated as decisions are made.

During this time it is critical that we stay connected (if only virtually or via our telephones) to one another, for that is how a community gains its strength and purpose.



# FROM OUR TEMPLE PRESIDENT

In Ongoing Pursuit Of: **Teshuvah-**Forgiveness and Acceptance, **Tefillah-**Meaningful Worship, **Tzedakah-**Righteous Acts

#### Virtual Shabbat

Hopefully by the time you read this we will have been able to successfully set up virtual Friday Night Shabbat Services and Saturday Morning Torah Study with our two Rabbis. Virtual services to me are less than ideal, but are our only option during these trying times with the Covid-19 pandemic.



The following was my experience on Friday Night 3/21/20. I first attempted to watch the service at Temple Emanu El Houston at 6 PM, but was frustrated by only being able to access audio, but not video. I found this unfulfilling. I then tried Park Avenue Synagogue in Manhattan and easily caught the end of their service, which due to the time difference, started at 5 PM CST. When their service completed I went to Beth Israel Houston and easily accessed and watched their virtual Shabbat Service which began at 6:30 PM. As I sat there by myself in my shorts and T-shirt watching their Shabbat Service, it seemed that something was missing. I was feeling somewhat sorry for myself about the entire situation with the virus, then my wife, Susan, came into the room. She had just returned from the funeral visitation of an acquaintance whose 21 year old daughter had finally been allowed to die, after spending 6 months in a deep coma due to an All-Terrain Vehicle accident. As I thought about this, I felt much less sorry for myself. My wife was obviously very sad about the situation she had just witnessed. She sat down beside me to watch the service and then everything changed. As we sat there together worshipping and sharing my single copy of Mishkan T'Filah, I no longer felt that something was missing. It was not that the service was virtual that was the problem. The problem was I was participating alone in a vacuum, so to speak, until she joined me. I then realized that part of the joy of Shabbat is sharing the experience with others, especially those we care about.

This then made me think about the concept of the Minyan. My research revealed the following: The requirement for a minyan is Talmudic, from Babylonian tractate Megillah 23b. There are three Torah source verses cited, which, using the hermeneutic rule of **gezerah shavah** (common terminology regarding a concept), conclude that a quorum of 10 is required: Leviticus 22:32, Numbers 16:21 and Numbers 14:27. The common terms of *congregation, sanctification* and *midst* are used to connect the concept of a congregation to that of sanctification. The size of a congregation is based on the number of spies, 10, that were sent out to report on the Land of Israel to the Jews prior to when they were supposed to enter the Land, from Numbers 14:27. A minyan is considered the minimum number for it to be considered a communal gathering rather than a group of individuals. Thus with less than a minyan certain prayers cannot be recited since they require a community. Without the community we are not at the correct level and thus cannot recite those specific prayers. Judaism is a religion that requires us to be part of something bigger than ourselves rather than just try to be holy and worship by ourselves.

I find it somewhat interesting that the current recommendations are to avoid gathering greater than 10. I tried to research where this seemly arbitrary number came from, but could not find any answers. Maybe they just wanted to preserve the Minyan, at least that is a nice thought. In the meantime as we try to navigate this new reality, and if you are able and feel comfortable doing so, sharing your virtual Shabbat Service with another congregant, may help you to spiritually get through these difficult and trying times.
