



FROM OUR TEMPLE PRESIDENT

In Ongoing Pursuit Of: **Teshuvah-**Forgiveness and Acceptance, **Tefillah-**Meaningful Worship, **Tzedakah-**Righteous Acts

Tzedakah

Erev Rosh Hashanah 2021/5782

We are now 1 year and 6 months into the Covid-19 pandemic. Despite this we have many things to be thankful for. We were back in our sanctuary this year for the



High Holy Days. We have Rabbi Chava Koster as our full time rabbi to attend to the spiritual, pastoral and educational needs of our congregation including the education of our youth. I have always been a strong proponent of the importance of having the right full time Rabbi to lead our congregation and also to represent the voice of Judaism in the community at large. I personally feel that we are exceedingly blessed to now have Rabbi Koster.

We are also so very truly blessed to have Angela, Dwight, Jane and Wilton.

Unlike this time last year, we have a vaccine against Covid-19 that is very effective against hospitalization and death in those who are fully vaccinated, even against the deadly Delta Strain. We have monoclonal antibody treatment that can significantly reduce the severity of the disease, as well as the incidence of hospitalization and death, when given appropriately to an individual who contracts Covid-19. For all these things and many more, we should be exceedingly thankful.

On Rosh Hashanah it is written, on Yom Kippur it is sealed ...but Teshuvah, Tefillah, Tzedakah temper judgment's severe decree.

I again want to discuss the idea of **Tzedakah**. **Tzedakah** has been one of the main themes of my Temple Emanuel Presidency. In the Torah, **Tzedakah** means "righteous behavior" and is often paired with "<u>justice</u>." The <u>rabbis</u> of classical Judaism praised Tzedakah, calling it, "equal in value to <u>all</u> the other <u>mitzvot</u> (commandments), combined." According to this definition, therefore **Tzedakah** is by far and away the greatest <u>mitzvot</u> that any individual can perform.

I have never liked the word dues. I pay dues to a local gym to have a place to work out. I pay dues to the American College of Cardiology and in return, I get free medical journals and continuing medical education at a discounted rate.

This is why when I give to our Temple, I consider this a **Tzedakah Offering** or a **Righteous Offering**. I do this because it is a <u>mitzvot</u> of such tremendous magnitude, that I consider it an immense blessing and actually a privilege to be able to do so. In fact I would like us to consider that going forward, we replace the term dues with the term **Tzedakah Offering** to reflect what I personally believe is the true nature of what this type of giving represents.

There are those who give generously to their Temple year after year. To these individuals I want to say thank you for your generosity, and for performing such a great *mitzvot*. But then there are those who will say that their Temple has plenty of money and therefore doesn't need very much or any of theirs. When I hear this I think to myself, "Why do you want to cheat God? Why would you not want to perform a *mitzvot* that is equal in value to **all** the other *mitzvot*, combined?"

The amount given is not important. What is important is your state of mind and what is truly in your heart as you give. I would argue that a person with only \$2 who gives \$1, has fulfilled a greater <u>mitzvot</u> then the person with \$100 who gives \$20.

On Rosh Hashanah it is written, on Yom Kippur it is sealed ...but Teshuvah, Tefillah, and especially Tzedakah temper judgment's severe decree.

I want to end with a blessing for our congregation that I wrote last year and that I have further expanded upon for this year:

Baruch atah, Adonai Eloheinu, Melech haolam.

Blessed is the Lord our God, ruler of the universe. Lord I ask you to grant the following to all of our congregation, their families, our community, our country, and to everyone on this Earth:

Grant Love and Kindness, with the ability to truly love one another and to be kind to one another despite our differences, religious, ethnic, racial, political or otherwise.

Grant Peace, I pray to you, Lord for peace, understanding, and healing among all people on this Earth.

Grant Liberty, that all human beings everywhere can live without oppression, discrimination, fear, and with freedom of choice.

Grant Forgiveness, forgive us of our transgressions against you, but I especially pray for you to grant us the ability to sincerely forgive each other, for all our transgressions whether they are real, perceived, imagined, or otherwise.

Grant Serenity, with the ability to remain calm in the face of adversity.

Grant Joy, with the ability to be happy despite current or future circumstances, be they good, bad, or indifferent.

Grant Hope, with hope for today, hope for tomorrow, and hope for the future.

TEMPLE EMANUEL COVID-19 GUIDELINES AS OF AUGUST 18, 2021

CONGREGATION TEMPLE EMANUEL—BEAUMONT, TEXAS

In the best interest of our Congregation, the Board of Trustees have voted that we will return to the following guidelines:

Mask mandate and social distancing required.

Masks and hand sanitizer available upon entry.

One (1) person at a time in the restrooms.

Bring your own Kippah and Tallit, Temple will not provide.

Leave Prayer Books in your Sanctuary seat.

Family seating will be allowed (every 3rd row with 3 seats in between families). At this time we will not reinstate the roping off of rows/seats.

Kiddush & Motzi will be conducted only on the Bimah.

Staggered dismissal from Sanctuary from front to back.

The Board of Trustees will continue to monitor this ever fluent COVID-19 pandemic and our guidelines may be revised as necessary.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

(paraphrased from a handout Dr. Wayne Margolis is giving all his patients)

The monoclonal antibody treatment is being severely underutilized in our community. If you or a loved one is diagnosed with COVID-19, you need to aggressively pursue treatment. The Delta variant of COVID-19 is now the predominant strain in the United States. This strain is 100% more contagious than the original viral strain. In addition it appears to cause more severe disease even in younger individuals. I therefore strongly recommend that everyone get vaccinated!

If you do contract COVID-19 whether you are vaccinated or unvaccinated, please contact your primary care physician immediately for consideration of the monoclonal antibody infusion. This treatment can significantly alter the course of your COVID-19 infection and potentially avoid hospitalization with serious illness.
