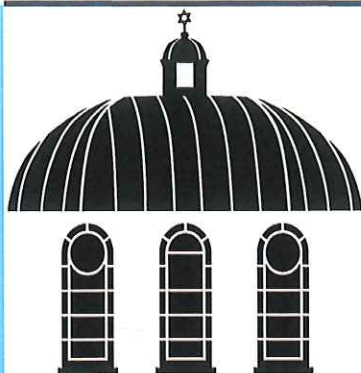

FROM OUR TEMPLE RABBI

Pesakh for me works, the way la Madeleine
cookie worked for Proust. I recall huge wooden
planks that miraculously changed into tables,
the sound of feathers brushing the inside for
cleaned cabinets, the smell of shoe polish, and
the grinding sound of metal on metal, as I held
on for dear life to the gefilte fish grinder
clipped onto the kitchen counter.



I was six years old, when I found the *matzah* which my great
grandfather had placed in a linen napkin and hidden in the bedroom. I
had glued my eyes on him from the moment he performed
the *yahatz* ceremony, breaking the middle *matzah* into two unequal
parts and replacing the smaller part in its original position. When he
returned to the table, I looked forward to the search and retrieval. I
knew, as did all the children around the *seder* table, that he or she
who found the concealed, larger part, the *afikomen*, could hold out for
any prize.

I wonder what the prizes will be at your Seder table this year. A toy, a
computer game or an envelope with money? Might I suggest an
additional idea, why not explain to your children and grandchildren
that this year with homeless people from Afghanistan and the
Ukraine, on the run because of war, fleeing towards an unknown

place, an insecure future, the best prize would be something they can share with others. This year, let your children and grandchildren choose which charity, which tzedakah fund, they should like to give their afikomen money to. Help them to start a toy drive for all those children who had to leave their toys and belongings, and their home behind. The story is already known to them, for we tell it every year at our Seder table, once we were slaves, now we are free. Let us help all those who are enslaved by war, walk a little taller, because they know they are not alone.

We have received some wonderful news about Dr. Laura Cochrane’s visit to Beaumont on November 4&5, 2021:

Shannon Harris, a reporter for KLVU, had an interview with her about the Art and Architecture of Temple Emanuel. As you know Rabbi Samuel Rosinger was significantly involved in the design of our sanctuary. She informed Dr. Cochrane that their interview had won first place in the Texas Association of Broadcasters Awards for Best Documentary. Mazel Tov to you. Dr. Cochrane spoke at the Mamie McFadden Ward House under the auspices of Lamar University, was speaking on The Art and Architecture of Temple Emanuel and had tours of Temple Emanuel the next day. Dr. Cochrane has ties to our area. Her aunts are Fern Roos and Esterlyn Dugan. Her mother, Lois Cochrane (z’l) was their sister. Dr. Cochrane is associate Professor/Coordinator of Art History and Visual Arts at Middle Tennessee State University in Murfreesboro, TN

Yizkor

Isaac Bashevis Singer once remarked: “We Jews have many faults, but amnesia is not among them.” We are perhaps the only people who use the past as a lead into our future.

The yizkor service, better known as the memorial service in English, started off as modest addition to the Ashkenazi (Eastern European) morning service for Yom Kippur. The custom arose in Germany, following the devastation of Rhineland Jewry during the Crusades, a trauma that was made worse in the 14th century when the Jews were held responsible for the plague.


The custom of Yizkor spread, and eventually was extended to be included on the last day of the three Pilgrim festivals, Sukkot, Passover, and Shavuot. That said, Yizkor has remained a predominantly Ashkenazic tradition. Most Sephardi communities have their own custom of memorializing their loved ones in the Hashkavah.

The Hashkavah of the edot hamizrach (the Sephardic communities of the Mediterranean and the Middle East) is a regular occurrence, barely noticed by the congregants. A person normally buys the privilege of being called to the Torah, and with that purchase comes an automatic Hashkavah for the person’s family.

Usually, the chazzan recites the abbreviated version of the Hashkavah after each Aliyah.

May He who is merciful to all his creatures have pity, Compassion and mercy upon the lower soul, spirit, and higher soul of (name of deceased) May the spirit of God place him, her in the Garden of Eden.

References to the lower and higher soul, refer to the three Hebrew words for soul that kabalistic tradition associated with different aspects of “soulness” arranged in a hierarchy. Whatever tradition you might follow, Temple Emanuel usually has a Yizkor service on last day of Sukkot, Passover, and Shavuot.

Congregation Temple Emanuel Sisterhood April 2022

Temple Emanuel Sisterhood Board met March 9, 2022 in the Temple Library. The Sisterhood Board discussed/approved the following items:

- Sisterhood Mahj Day of Fun: May 11, 2022. A light breakfast and Mexican Fiesta Lunch will be served. We will play four (4) rounds of Mahj and prizes will be awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place winner. Door prizes will be drawn at various times during the day.
- Spring Luncheon: May 18, 2022 at 12 Noon in the Swerdlow-Roosth Social Hall. A box lunch from Jason's Deli will be provided. Donations for lunch graciously appreciated. Zena Stephens, Jefferson County Sheriff will be our guest speaker. Invitations will be mailed out to Sisterhood members at the end of April 2022.
- Fall Cheesecake Baking Days: Plans are underway for our Fall Fundraiser. Sisterhood members will tentatively begin cheesecake baking on Tuesday starting in September. Proposed baking days include September 6th, 13th, 20th, & 28th; October 11th, 18th, & 25th; November 1st, & 8th. We may need to include several Sunday baking days tentatively scheduled for October 9th and November 6th. Be on the watch during the summer months for Cheesecake Baking Day Shift. 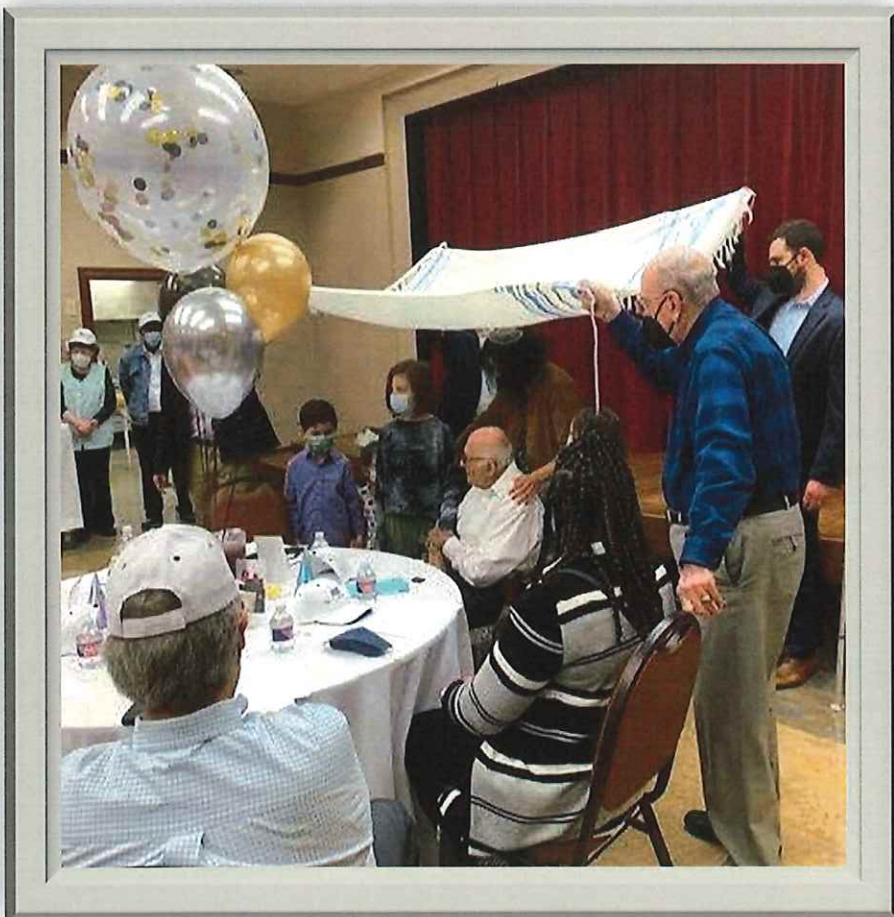
Temple Emanuel Social Justice Committee

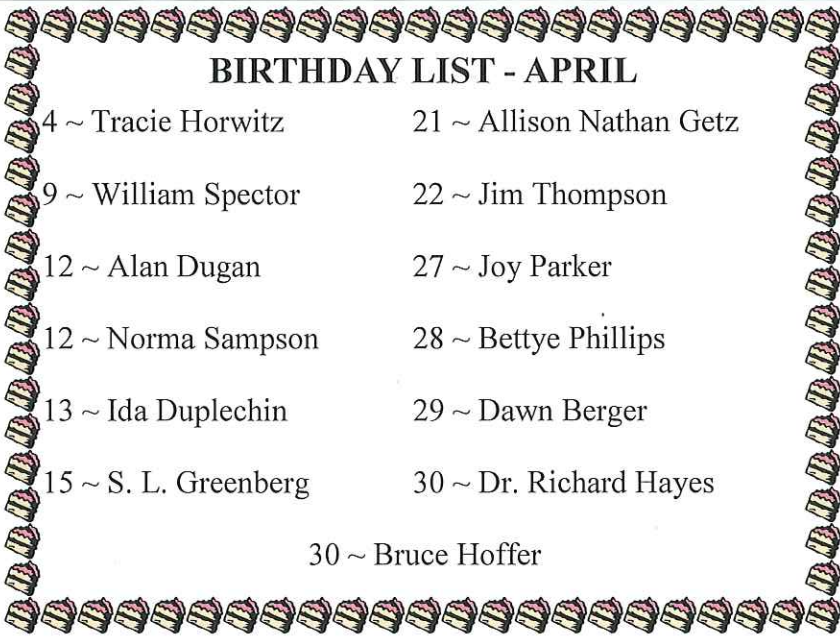
