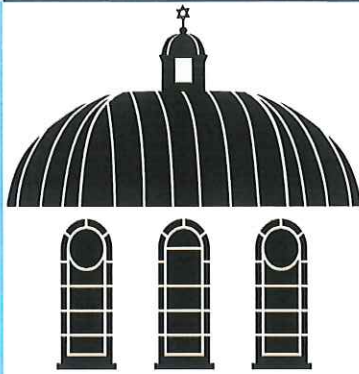

FROM OUR TEMPLE RABBI

Let's make our Temple's future count.

There is a lot of counting going on in our tradition, counting songs during the Seder, counting of the Omer and the counting of our curses or blessings, if you will, in the Torah portions we have read over the past few weeks. As individuals we count the days, but as leaders we must count the years. As private persons we can think about tomorrow, but in our role as leaders we must think long-term, focusing our eyes on the far horizon. Let me first begin with thanking all of you for all the work you have done on behalf of our community this year. From baking cheesecakes, providing helping hands at Some Other Place, the tireless work of our social justice committee, our cemetery committee making sure our cemetery is a safe and beautiful resting place, serving on the Board of Trustees, our finance committee, and our brotherhood and sisterhood. "Who is wise?" asked Ben Zoma and answered: "One who foresees the consequences." Leaders, if they are wise, think about the impact of their decisions many years from now. Jewish history is replete with just such long-term thinking. When Moses, on the eve of the exodus, focused the attention of the Israelites on how they would tell the story to their children in the years to come, he was taking the first step to making Judaism a religion built on education, study, and the life of the mind. Leaders who truly want to lead think long-term and build for the future. Tweeting leaders might sound good for about five minutes, but they last as long as their comb overs. Understanding the future is based on deep study of the past. The challenge for our Temple community today is to move from a community proud of its past to one focused on its future. I hope we can make that the focus in the year to come.

SISTERHOOD SCHMOOZE—JUNE & JULY 2022

Congregation Temple Emanuel Sisterhood June/July 2022

Temple Emanuel Sisterhood and/or Board had a very busy May 2022. The Board met on Wednesday, May 4, 2022, in the Temple Library, and made the following recommendations to the general membership for consideration at their May 18, 2022, Spring Luncheon:

- ◆ Fall Cheesecake Baking Fundraiser: The membership was informed that the goal is to make 288 cheesecakes during the months of September, October and the first two weeks of November. It was also recommended that the price of an individual cheesecake be raised to \$35. Membership was also informed that an email will go out addressing the need for volunteers and the sign opportunities. Tentative baking days include **September 6th, 13th, 20th, & 28th; October 11th, 18th, & 25th; November 1st, & 8th.**
- ◆ Fall Mahj Day of Fun: It was recommend to the general membership that a Fall Mahj Day of Fun be placed on the Temple calendar for this coming fall
- ◆ Memorial Book 2022: Laura Thomas stated that she was recommending that Sisterhood continue with the Memorial Book for High Holidays 2022.

All the above recommendations were passed by the general membership of Temple Emanuel Sisterhood. Also, please be on the watch for your sisterhood dues statement for fiscal year 2022-2023.

Spring Mahj Day of Fun on May 11, 2022 was a huge success. A total of 40 women from around Beaumont and the surrounding area signed up to play Mahj.
