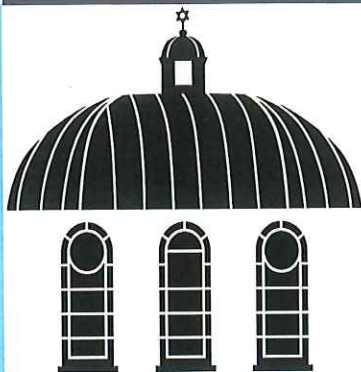

FROM OUR TEMPLE RABBI

The world can be a scary place. Every time we pick up the morning paper or turn on the television, the media provides us with more evidence of just how terrifying life can be. Fires raging out of control, entire states under water, brutal warfare in the Ukraine and the Middle East and elsewhere, gangs, terrorism, illness, death, unemployment, and a host of more private sorrows form the constant companions of the living. There is not a person alive who has not tasted the bitterness of disappointment and of tragedy. We are all wounded by the simple act of living. The dangers of life are not simply the innovations of modernity. On every page of the Torah, we read of the challenges and torments that afflicted our ancestors! Childlessness, sibling rivalry, murder, loveless marriages, rape, war. Even the greatest of all prophets, Moses, encountered enough bitterness that he several times suggested that his own death would be preferable to the life he was living. So it becomes particularly noteworthy to listen in on his farewell address presented to us in last book of the Torah, Devarim, delivered on the border of the Promised Land, with the people of Israel assembled and attentive to their aged and unparalleled



leader. What new message did Moses bring? Twice he repeats the same idea: Fear not and be not dismayed. What is going on here? Surely Moses, a man who has suffered so profoundly, knows that life is no bed of roses. Perhaps what the Torah is teaching is the right attitude with which to face and meet life. In a sense, our propensity to fear can be our worst enemy, more dangerous than the object of our fear itself. In the face of the unknown, our fantasies often are more ominous than our realities. Fear is the ally of tragedy, transforming spirited and resourceful humans into whimpering and passive victims. Half of the battle lies in a refusal to give in to fear, our stiff-necked resistance to dismay. Ultimately, the faith of all humanity, is the resilience of hope. Refusing to give in to despair, refusing to be crippled by tragedy, to possess the ability to muster the inner resilience that comes from spiritual depth and a vision of holiness that transcends time. It is not that we can avoid suffering entirely, but we can fashion our response to suffering. Just as our ancestors responded to suffering with a renewed commitment to God, we too can make our mark in the world by how we choose to confront pain and disappointment. By living our lives in the way of goodness, by cultivating a rich connection to our God and humanity, by making it our business to alleviate the suffering of others, we vindicate Moses insight and embody his remarkable courage: Fear not, even in troubled times. It is my hope that we can carry this message into this Rosh haShannah, this Jewish New Year, for us and all of humanity.

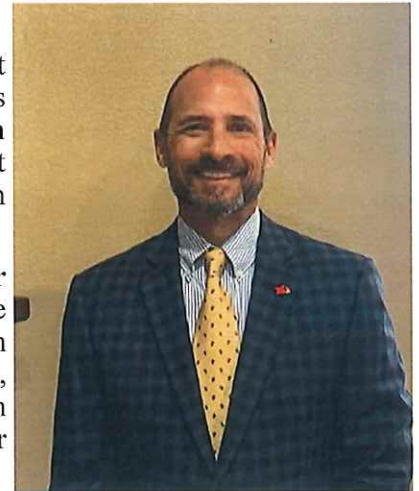


FROM OUR TEMPLE PRESIDENT

Dear Congregants & Friends of Temple Emanuel,

The great Rabbi Hillel of the first century challenges us with three significant questions:

If I am not for myself, who will be for me? If I am only for myself, what am I? And if not now, when?

This ancient challenge fueled the life of honor, integrity, and service lived by Rabbi Samuel J. Rosinger of blessed memory. During his 50-year tenure at Temple Emanuel, Rabbi Rosinger cast a giant shadow of compassion, courage, leadership, and faith across Southeast Texas. His legacy along with our *Love Thy Neighbor Initiative* that had started in 2011 (following the tragic shooting in Tucson, AZ) led to the 2014 **Rabbi Samuel J. Rosinger Humanitarian Award Dinner**, now in its seventh year... after two years of Covid-Sabbatical.

The **Rabbi Samuel J. Rosinger Humanitarian Award** is presented to an individual/individuals in Southeast Texas whose life/lives of honor, integrity and service exemplifies/exemplify the ancient teaching of Rabbi Hillel, affirms the legacy of Rabbi Rosinger, and moves Southeast Texas closer to becoming the kind of community our children deserve. In 2022, we will present the **Humanitarian Award** to **Allison Nathan Getz** and **Reverend Dr. James R. Fuller**, whose legacies of service exceed the space of this letter!

The **Guest Speaker at the 2022 Rabbi Samuel J. Rosinger Humanitarian Award Dinner** is **Anna Salter-Eisen**, a leading voice in Holocaust education. In 1998, after years of serving as a docent at the Dallas Memorial Center for Holocaust Studies (now the Dallas Holocaust and Human Rights Museum), she wanted to know the secrets that her parents were keeping locked inside themselves related to their life during the Holocaust. The result was a family trip with her parents and siblings to revisit Poland and the notorious Holocaust sites including Warsaw, Krakow, Auschwitz, and the concentration camps, ghetto, and hometown from her father's youth. Salter-Eisen became the author of two Holocaust books...both her father's story in *The 23rd Psalm: A Holocaust Memoir* and the companion sequel, her own story, in *Pillar of Salt: A Daughter's Life in the Shadow of the Holocaust*. She is producing a Holocaust documentary film titled *In My Father's Words* which is based on the two memoirs. **Anna Salter-Eisen** will provide a dynamic multimedia presentation at the **2022 Rabbi Samuel J. Rosinger Humanitarian Award Dinner**.
