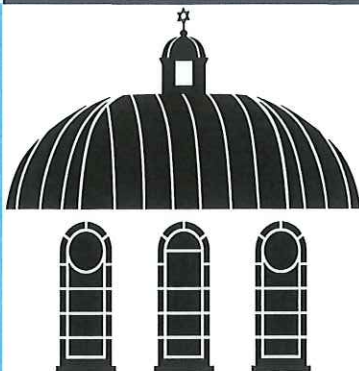

FROM OUR TEMPLE RABBI

I read this article a year ago, as it appeared in an Italian newspaper La Stampa. As always when a story, joke or anecdote stands out for me, I put it into a special file. We just began the month of Elul, with its insistence on turning and returning, I hope this little vignette will be as meaningful to you, as it was and is to me.

A 93-year-old man was stricken with COVID-19 and in spite of his age he somehow survived. Upon being discharged from the hospital, he was presented with a very large bill. Part of it was for payment for the ventilator which he had been put on for one day.



Reading the amount that was due, the old man began to cry. The hospital felt a sense of compassion and told him not to worry – surely something could be worked out to reduce the cost to something more manageable. What the old man responded made the hospital workers weep.

The old man explained, “I don’t cry because of the money I have to pay. Thankfully I am able to afford it. I cry for another reason. I cry because I’ve just come to realize after all these many years on earth, I’ve been breathing God’s air for 93 years, yet I have never had to pay for it. It seems it takes over €500 to use a ventilator in the hospital for one day. Do you know how much I owe God? Why haven’t I ever truly thanked God all the days of my life for the miracle of this divine gift which I took for granted?”

There is so much in this world that we take for granted as if it were ours by automatic right or well-deserved reward. We complain about the things we lack and hardly ever take the time to thank the Almighty for the priceless favours of God’s divine blessings. Somebody upset you this week, forgive them. Are you annoyed at the world, forgive yourself, because the world is an awfully big burden to carry by yourself, someone raised their voice at you, perhaps their pain was bigger than yours, or understand that not every culture uses the same level of volume you are used to. The Italians would say “Eh Normale.”

Eric Hoffer put it beautifully when he said the most difficult mathematics for almost all people is the ability to count their blessings.

So take a step back and let’s count our blessings together.
Have a sweet and meaningful Elul!

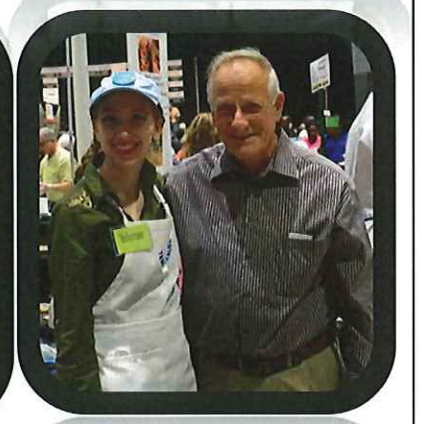

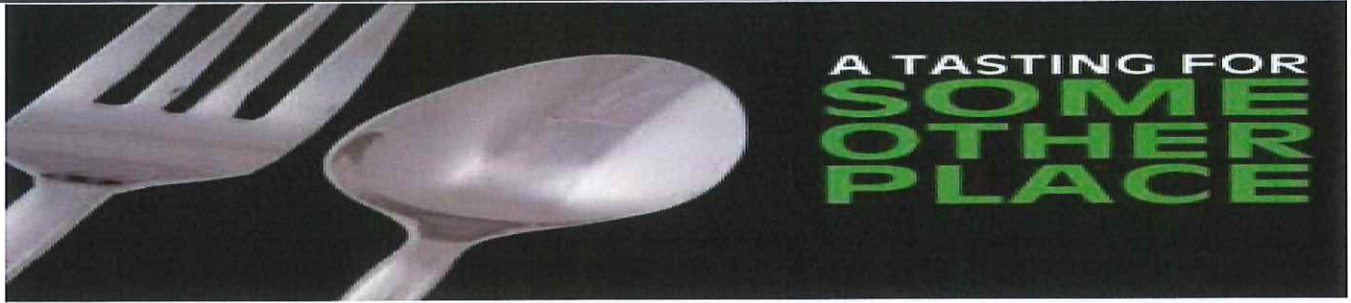

Items Needed:

Lulav — branch of a palm tree and sprigs of myrtle and willow

Etrog — citron

Materials to build a *sukkah* and decorations for it

Wine/Grape juice

Wine cups for each family member

Challah, a decorative cover and a bread knife

**Before Building the Sukkah**

READER: Eternal God, let Your presence dwell among us, and let us abide always in the shelter of Your peace. Be with us on this festival of Sukkot, as with love and awe we celebrate Your goodness to all the living.

ALL: *We build this Sukkah with joy and gratitude for the gift of life and for all that sustains our bodies and enriches our spirits.*

Each Day, Upon Entering the Sukkah

ברוך אתה יי אלהינו מלך העולם, אשר קדשנו במצותיו, וצונו לשוב בסוכה.

Ba-ruch A-ta A-do-nai, E-lo-hei-nu me-lech ha-o-lam, a-sher kid-sha-nu b'mitz-vo-tav, v'tzi-va-nu lei-sheiv ba-su-kah.

Blessed are You, O Lord, our God, Ruler of the Universe, who has made us holy with mitzvot and commanded us to dwell in the *sukkah*.

Only on the first day:

ברוך אתה יי אלהינו מלך העולם, שהחיינו וקיימנו והגיענו לזמן הזה.

With these four species I reach out to the Source of all life, the Sovereign of all Creation. Let the graciousness of our Eternal God be with us, and may our work have lasting value.
