

#### FROM OUR TEMPLE RABBI

Excerpt from the 129th Annual Congregational Dinner

Most of the biblical leaders in Judaism were figures who were not possessed of a great sense of destiny, determined from an early age on to achieve fame. If anything, they often doubted their own abilities. Many like Moses, became heroes of the right choice against their will. Why them? Why us? Who are we to be asked to perform a noble deed, or a courageous act? Yet very often, those people that have changed lives and mended people's pain, are just ordinary people. They did not have power, but they had something much more enduring, they had influence. Influence by the way they



inspired others and spoke to the better angels of our natures, that kind of leadership of influence seeks no power, but it changes lives. It reminded me of one of my favourite paintings. The irises by Van Gogh. When I look at that painting. I don't just see the interplay of light and dark, the essence of spring captured in oil. I see the heaviness of the paint, the sense of movement, and luminosity desperately trying to shape failure into beauty. A flower is not just a flower, it is chaos shaped into resplendence, stretching upward towards daylight. Every act of creation uses the same matter from the universe and transforms the void into the potential for meaning. Every time we commit ourselves to a project, whether it is to better ourselves, to start a new position or to choose to belong to a community. Every time we make something positive out of our lives together we function as a mirror of God's decision to light up the world, and as such we have tremendous influence. The power of the influence of us, of community keeps enriching our understanding of our ancient texts and brings new melodies to the text of our siddur, with the beautiful musicianship of Angela and Dwight. We are truly blessed to have such a dedicated duo. Wilton's influence can be found in the smallest corners of our community. Not only does he care for our building, our Sifrei Torah, most importantly he cares for each and every one of us, with humour and an unshakeable belief in God. Leah's can do attitude guides this synagogue and keeps us connected. A special thank you to our Board of Trustees, Committee heads and committees, your care and dedication for this community is obvious. Thank you to Ken Parker, a president who despite himself, and with a little nudging, had the courage to take on the direction of this congregation. I believe in this community; you have kept your Jewish traditions and connectedness. Your influence is clear in the respect all the other faith traditions have for this synagogue. ## Temple Emanuel Social Justice *Mitzvah* Opportunities March 2023 and Beyond

Each Temple Emanuel Social Justice Project continues to INCENTIVIZE Temple Members and Friends of Temple Emanuel to participate in the *tikkun olam* aspect of Temple Emanuel's *Love Thy Neighbor* Initiative and, therefore, the life of Temple Emanuel and the part that Temple Emanuel plays in Beaumont, Southeast Texas, and Beyond...thus helping to fulfill an important part of President Ken's mission for his term.

Menu of Tzedakah for your consideration in any amount is needed for each of the following:

- Humanitarian Relief in the form of day to day necessities for over 1,000 <u>Ukrainians</u> - women, children, babies, and the elderly - under the umbrella of Ester Felt's care. Ester, an American Jewish woman <u>living in Germany</u> since her husband is in the Military, is also the Lay Leader contact for Jewish troops. She has added another dimension to her *mitzvot*.
- Humanitarian Relief for the <u>Jewish Community of Turkey</u> which has been greatly affected by the earthquake. Jewish Federation of North America through its partners on the ground partner are providing what's needed at this time and will continue to monitor/fulfill the needs.
- Family Services of Southeast Texas for needs of the clients of the <u>Women's</u> and Children's Shelter.
- Kosher for Passover for Jewish Troops in AFRICOM...but there will, of course, there are also the Ukrainians who are Jewish who will also be at Passover Seders.
