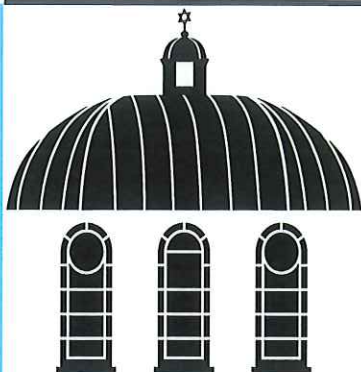

A sacred Jewish journey to enrich lives.

FROM OUR TEMPLE RABBI

There is a holiday that existed in biblical times and that has almost disappeared since then, you know it as Rosh Chodesh. In Biblical times, it was the custom for every family to come together for a feast and a sacrifice on Rosh Chodesh. What you might not know is that it is truly a holiday which celebrates friendship. The Haftarah we read is one which celebrates friendship. It celebrates the love and loyalty that existed between two people who should have been bitter enemies and fierce



competitors but who instead cared about each other and helped each other and came through for each other. The two people in the story are David, the son in law of King Saul, and Jonathan, the son of King Saul. These two people could have been, and perhaps should have been, rivals for the same throne. In our Haftarah, Jonathan hears a rumour that his father is going to assassinate David at the Rosh Chodesh meal. He tells David to stay away from the meal, and to make up some excuse. Jonathan advises David to hide in the woods and he will send him a signal, telling him whether it is safe for him to come back to the palace or whether he should run for his life. The signal is a very simple one. If David is in danger, Jonathan will shoot an arrow far off into the distance. While his servant boy goes looking for the arrow, David will have time to come out of the woods, and the two friends can hug each other one last time and bid each other farewell. But if the King is not planning to kill David, then Jonathan will shoot an arrow for just a short distance, and that will be a message that it is safe for David to come back home to the palace. Rosh Chodesh is a precursor to memorial day. So, as you are preparing to visit family and friends, and are getting ready for Summer, celebrate your friends.

Contact Leah Tuesday - Friday 10 am - 2:30 pm at 409-832-6131 to purchase your ticket(s). Some Other Place has an ecumenical mission where people of all faiths come together to provide service to those in need of assistance. Tickets remain \$10 and includes free parking. Ticket sales for the Tasting help keep the programs of Some Other Place working. Programs include emergency services such as food, clothing, shelter, utilities, medicine, and transportation. Meals-on-Wheels delivers hot lunches to homebound residents three days a week. The Nutrition Center serves a hot lunch four days a week and a sack lunch 2 days. Programs like Back-to-School, Thanksgiving Store, and Christmas Giving Tree make life a little easier for many, many people in our community. Fifty (50) houses of worship, and other non-profits/businesses will host booths of delicious treats at the Tasting. On the tables this year are sweet noodle kugel, gumbo, shrimp, yam bar, brisket bites, strawberry shortcake and so much more. Of course Mid-Life Crisis, a local musical band will be performing again this year. Make plans to buy a ticket to help support this worthy cause and come enjoy the wonderful evening in downtown Beaumont at the Civic Center.
