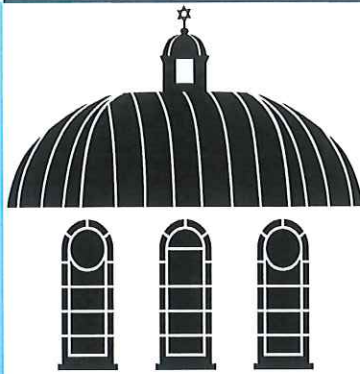

FROM OUR TEMPLE RABBI

August is synonymous to the month of Elul for me. It begins a period of intensive introspection, of clarifying my life's goals, and dreams and of coming closer to God. It is a time for that spiritual hokey pokey, you have to put all of yourself in there and be willing to turn it all around, in order to be able to step back and look at yourself critically and honestly, as Jews have from time immemorial, with the intention of improving. While historically we are a people who value, if not cherish, responsibility, how often do we hear, "It's not my job"; "It's not my problem"; "It's not my fault"; "It's the way I am." Much has been written of suggesting we are simply genetically determined products, that our DNA makes us who we are and makes us do what we do.

While we all acknowledge that our genetic matter certainly influences what we are, does it indeed determine how we act, or if we are responsible for our actions? I took comfort in the words of Dr. Dominic Purpura, noted neuro-scientist – "Genes are not destiny. They tell us where we came from, not what we can become." "We must be better than our excuses; we are humans." How do we set aside time for inner reflection, slowing down enough to notice those thoughts and feelings that cause discomfort and even agitation? It is the new year that affords us this opportunity, even demands it of us. To move forward, to heal, to forgive, to grow so that we are the most and the best we can be for the new year.



It made me think of lyrics in Leonard Cohen's song Anthem:

Ring the bells that still can ring
Forget your perfect offering
There is a crack, a crack in everything
That's how the light gets in.
That's how the light gets in.
That's how the light gets in.

When do we focus on the cracks? How do we heal those cracks in our lives and hearts? Why do we leave those cracks unattended only to grow and deepen? We all have cracks in our lives. Take the time to recognize them and remember, it is through the cracks that the light shines through. May this New Year bring each of us more light and illumination.

Temple Emanuel Family and Friends,

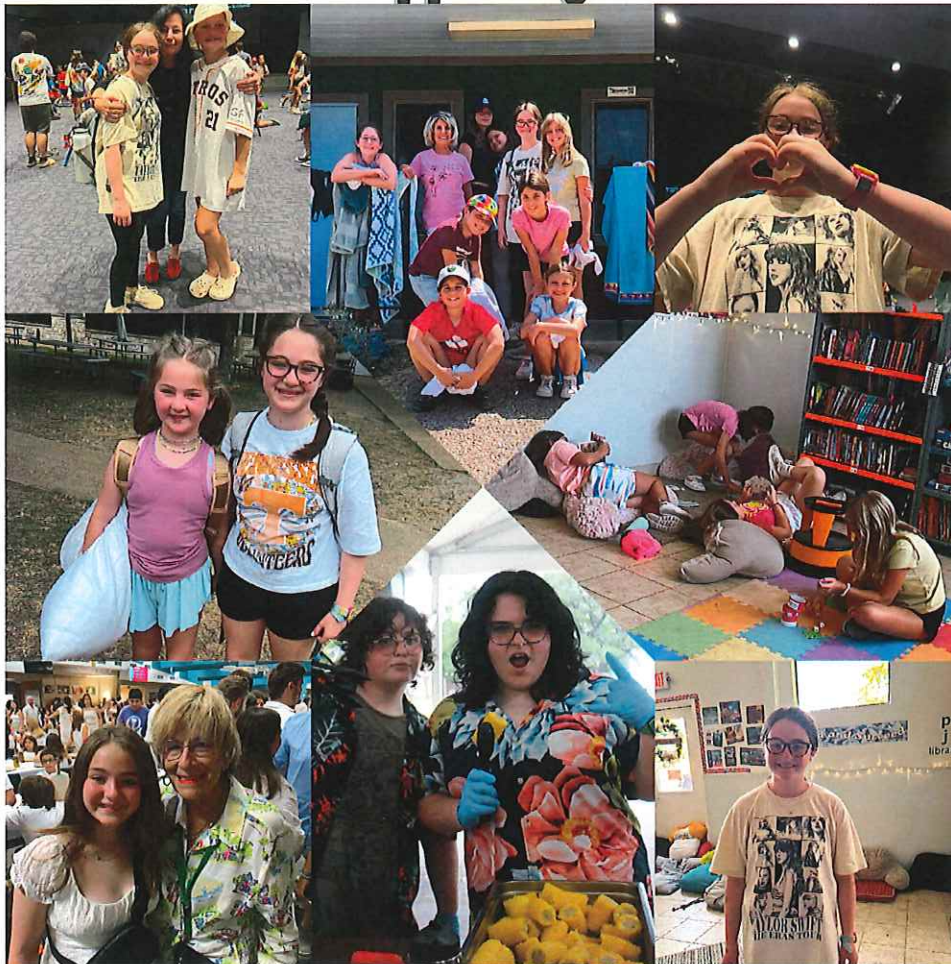

Some Other Place has an ecumenical mission where people of all faiths come together to provide service to those in need of assistance. Tickets remain \$10 and includes free parking. All volunteers must have a ticket to gain access to the Civic Center.

Ticket sales help keep the programs of Some Other Place working. Programs include emergency services such as food, clothing, shelter, utilities, medicine, and transportation. Meals-on-Wheels delivers hot lunches to homebound residents three days a week. The Nutrition Center serves a hot lunch four days a week and a sack lunch 2 days. Programs like Back-to-School, Thanksgiving Store, and Christmas Giving Tree make life a little easier for many, many people in our community.
