DID YOU KNOW?

"Until February 1, 1900, Jewish services were held at the HARMONY CLUB, located on the second floor of the Central Fire Station. The first Temple Emanuel Sanctuary was a framed building of somewhat Byzantine design, located at the corner of Broadway and Willow streets, now the site of Beaumont's First Baptist Church. When dedicated, this sanctuary held 300 worshipers, about the census of Beaumont's Jewish population in that time."

GUEST COLUMN *by Sarah Thomas Mann

So often we think about the far off past when we think about the history of a building, an organization, or a group of people, but the truth is, our immediate past and our present are an integral part of that story too. Our stories, our experiences, no matter how recent or seemingly minor, will become a part of the tapestry of our lives. The same holds true for the life of Temple Emanuel. No one story is more or less important and all of them shape us as a whole.

My story here at Temple Emanuel began in May 1997 when my dad, Gene Thomas, converted under Rabbi Peter Hyman. Little did he know that his choice would influence me and then later my mom, Laura Thomas, to follow his lead. In those first few years, we would come to the occasional service, but my son was a toddler, and it was quite a challenge to corral him for an hour. I remember distinctly the day that he ran up the isle during the service to sit on the step and "listen" to the service and the Hanukkah dinner where he kept trying to blow out the candles. It's a good thing he was cute!

Later, once my daughter was born, I started to feel the pull to do more than attend the occasional service. For me, I found a sense of peace and a strong sense of family in the people here at Temple Emanuel. Back then, there were many adult education opportunities and I started getting more active, learning more and feeling like I had found my place. This journey led me and my little family to follow in Dad's footsteps and start our own path toward Judaism. Finally, after years of study (and a move to San Antonio and back) my daughter, Alice, and I completed our conversion in 2009 under Rabbi Barbara Metzinger. Alice was only 5 and likely did not really understand but she would as the years went on. We spent the next few years deep into Sisterhood, Deli Day, Religious School and Social Justice. Those friendships and relationships continue to this day. Those truly were the "good old days". Rabbis came and went as well as members, but the core, the foundation was and is still strong. Alice was the last Bat Mitzvah for our congregation in 2017 and in what seemed like moments before that, my Mom finished her conversion with Rabbi Mathew Michaels. It makes me sad to think about how few life cycle events we have now but I am also thankful that we are still here, still a family and still a strong presence in Southeast Texas.






