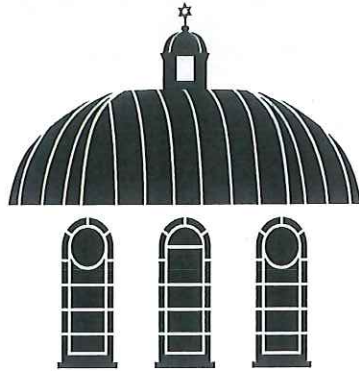

As example, let me begin with whom I remember:

I remember Past President Charlie Weinbaum...my mentor and friend...who told stories about how his grandfather had been on the Search Committee that met Rabbi Rosinger at the train station in 1910 and had hired him before he left town. In addition, Charlie shared that his grandfather had been the Chair of the Building Committee of our beloved Main Sanctuary . . . and his expertise as an engineer was important during every aspect of the construction. The Congregants of Temple Emanuel over the years and the community of Beaumont from Rotary to A&M Club to Little League and more gained so much from good people who understood the importance of sharing their dedication to leadership. Grandfather, father, and son all served as Presidents of Temple Emanuel . . . from Hyman Asher Perlstein, to Charles Weinbaum, Sr. to Charles "Charlie" Weinbaum, Jr. And, of course, we all remember how Charlie, wearing his maroon blazer as a proud Aggie, would take the first seat of the 7th row every Shabbat because that row starting with that seat is where he remembered sitting with his grandparents and his parents and with his wife and children. I will always remember Charlie and the conversation that I had with him the Monday before he died about my term as President. He is always in my mind when I am working on Temple business. Everyone loved Charlie, one of our 1st Rabbi Samuel Rosinger Humanitarian Award recipients, for his *Ohiedohie* spirit and his gentle nature.

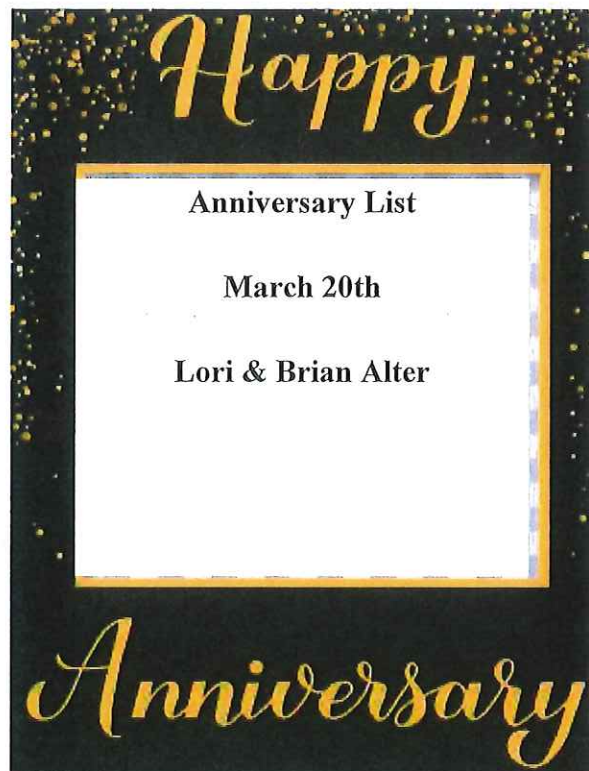
