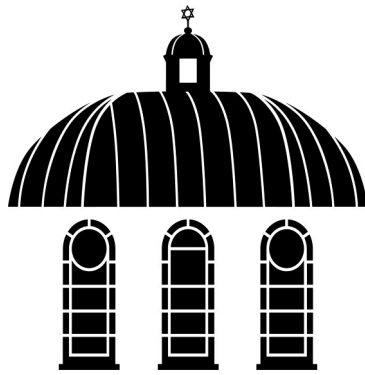

DID YOU KNOW?

Physical growth at Temple Emanuel resulted in a complex of buildings in the historic Downtown area of the city. The ROSINGER CENTER was named in honor of RABBI SAMUEL ROSINGER after its completion in 1957. In 1962, the Congregation dedicated the CLARA MILLER CHINSKI School Building and the JACOB S. GORDON Chapel.

Rabbi Rosinger was designated Temple Emanuel's Rabbi Emeritus in 1960 after RABBI NEWTON J. FRIEDMAN was named his successor. Rabbi Friedman served Temple Emanuel from 1957 until the time of his death in 1970. A charismatic speaker and scholar, Rabbi Friedman was active in the general community, becoming the first Rabbi to serve as the President of the Beaumont Ministerial Association.

GUEST COLUMN **by Alan Sampson

This month's Guest Column is by Alan Sampson. Alan, as a native of Beaumont, remembers many people who were important to him during his lifetime of living in Beaumont. The asterisk *replaces the repetition of z"l:

My parents *Sade (Leaman) and Mose Sampson first belonged to Temple Emanuel and then to both Temple Emanuel and Kol Israel. Temple Emanuel was the older of the two Congregations...the former being Reform which was composed of families of the Germanic/French background, and the latter starting as Orthodoxy was composed of families of Russian and Eastern European background. But, Kol Israel shifted to Conservatism as did many other Orthodox Congregations across America during the early 1950's.

My paternal grandfather was originally Orthodox and had come from Russian-Polish background. His first home in the United States was in Perth Amboy, New Jersey. In time, *Baruch Sampson came to Texas to work in Houston with his brother Abe during the early days of scrap iron. Baruch tired of the horse and wagon route from Houston through Beaumont and other places and made the decision to move to Beaumont where he started Sampson Iron & Steel Corporation in 1916.

Grandpa Sampson was the most comfortable praying in Kol Israel which for several years met in a rented hall until they had their first building in 1917. At some point, Grandpa Sampson served as President of Kol Israel as did my father who had had his Orthodox Bar Mitzvah in Perth Amboy, New Jersey.

My father had met my mother (daughter of *Anna and Morris Leaman) in Galveston where her family belonged to two congregations...one of which was Orthodox Congregation Beth Jacobs and the other was Reform Congregation B'nai Israel where Rabbi Henry Cohen was her Rabbi. Rabbi Cohen was to Galveston what Rabbi Samuel Rosinger was to Beaumont. My mother, of course, was involved in Sisterhood at Kol Israel and at Temple Emanuel but had been Sisterhood President at Kol Israel.

In the beginning Jewish families lived in neighborhoods that were in the area of Beaumont around what we know as Crockett Street. My family knew *Rabbi Samuel Rosinger as a neighbor and as a friend and always thought very highly of him. Rabbi Rosinger made certain that there were social events that included both Conservative and Reform families...which was especially important after World War II. There was the Young Men's Hebrew Association which consisted of a cross section of men of both congregations including my father.

I was born in 1946 at St. Therese Hospital just across the street from the main entrance of Temple Emanuel. That was after my paternal grandmother *Anna Sampson had died, so I was named for her. The hospital was torn down, sold to Temple Emanuel, and over time became the location of The Orchard.

I grew up in both congregations spending High Holidays and other Services as well with my parents, siblings, and grandfather at Kol Israel and Sukkot and other Festivals at Temple Emanuel. We celebrated Passover in my parents' home or in the home of my *Aunt Sophie (Sampson) and Uncle Jake Eisen. When old enough, I went to Hebrew School at Kol Israel and to Religious School at Temple Emanuel.

*Rabbi Samuel Rosinger was Rabbi of Temple Emanuel early on when I was growing up. Religious School at Temple Emanuel back then was in the basement beneath the Main Sanctuary. I remember teachers: *Dave Abelman, *Helen Breen, *June Klein, *Gladys Koshkin, *Leonard Mothner, *Harold Simmons, and, of course, Rabbi Rosinger, to name a few. Fast forward to when I was preparing to become Bar Mitzvah: I studied in Rabbi Rosinger's Office which was just a few steps down from the Bimah of the Main Sanctuary. Today that space serves as somewhat of a museum just off the Main Sanctuary.

So, I became Bar Mitzvah in the Main Sanctuary of Temple Emanuel under the guidance of Rabbi Rosinger. And, I was confirmed with my classmates in 1961 by both *Rabbi Newton Friedman and Rabbi Rosinger who by then was Rabbi Emeritus; and because my classmates were all born after World War II, the class of Baby Boomers was a relatively large class...a class that included *Ginger Greenberg (daughter of *Leah and Sigmund Greenberg, *Joann Spector (daughter of *Doris and Hyman Spector, Connie Spector (daughter of *Emily and Sam Spector), Gail Eldridge (daughter of *Rosalind and Oscar Eldridge), Joe Williams (son of *Coy and Leo Williams), Clyde Shields (son of Elise and Clyde Shields), Harry Breen (son of *Helen and Irving "Sonny" Breen), Richard Steinhart (son of *Marga and Werner Steinhart), and myself. The mothers, all members of Sisterhood, worked together in Rosinger Center to create a beautiful reception for us. But it had been my mother, my *Aunt RosaLee Leaman Roosth (Cynthia Wolf's Mother), and *Doris Spector who had decorated the Social Hall of Rosinger Center for my Bar Mitzvah several years earlier. I do remember that it had been elaborate!

I remember that in May, which marked the end of the Sunday School year, there were picnics that Temple Emanuel Brotherhood sponsored. We played baseball at those picnics. Sometimes they were held at Tyrrell Park.

I also remember that the men of both congregations participated in a Bowling League: Paul Kessler, *Maury Meyers, *Ocky Davis, *Izzy Drayer, *Icky Harris, *Joe Horwitz, *Philip Horwitz, *Meyer Krasnow, *Leon Finegold, *Sonny Molack, *Ben Goldstein, and my brother *Gerald Sampson, to name and remember a few.

I love Temple Emanuel for the memories that I made of what we did and of the people. And, it is because of the people that I remember that I volunteer as Chair of the Cemetery Committee...as I knew so many of those buried there along with my parents and with my sister *Joan and my brother *Gerald, whom everyone called "Pee Wee".

Whatever their backgrounds, the Jewish community lived life together!

Temple Emanuel has been the Center of my religious life for many years and also the life of my family. Norma and I were married in the Main Sanctuary. The Main Sanctuary is also where our children Sarah, Micah, and Benjamin were consecrated into Sunday School (which, by the way, met in the classrooms of Clara Miller Chinski School Building which used to also house the Jacob S. Gordon Chapel...now a Workroom/Waiting Area.) The Main Sanctuary is where Sarah and Micah became B'nei Mitzvah and where Benjamin became Bar Mitzvah; where all three of our children became Confirmands; and where Benjamin's daughter Eve Johanna was named. Our sons also celebrated their Eagle Scout Courts of Honor at Temple Emanuel.

And no matter the occasion, Norma...before, during, and after she was Sisterhood President and Temple President...made certain that the Swerdlow-Roosth Social Hall was both elaborately and welcomingly decorated for all to enjoy not only those for our family's milestones but also for so many of the milestones of our Congregational Family...some of whom will be reading this. 

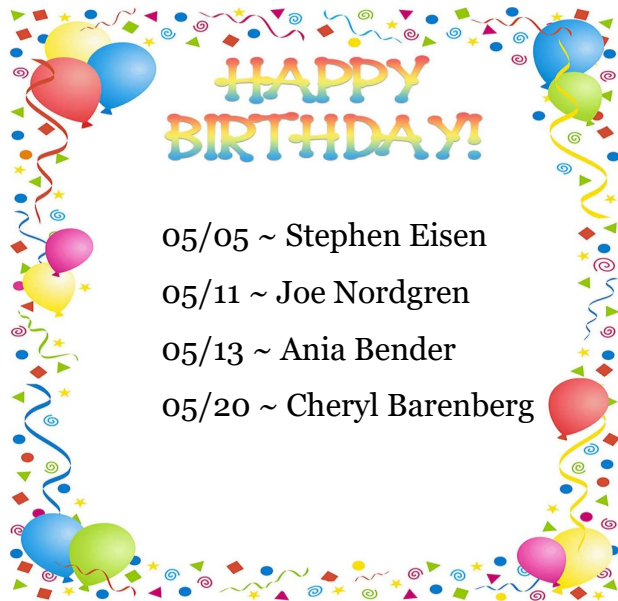
