



Proclaimation

WHEREAS, Jewish history is tightly woven into our cultural tapestry; and

WHEREAS, artists and intellectuals of all backgrounds allude to the Promised Land, the parting of the Red Sea, forty years of wandering in the wilderness, and Manna from Heaven in a wide variety of contexts, and

WHEREAS, in modern times Jewish Americans have achieved boundless success in public service, academia, business, sports and the fine arts and these men and women embody a set of values that has influenced American thought at the most fundamental level, and they have personally shaped the development of our nation and our city from its earliest days, and

WHEREAS, each year the month of May is set aside to celebrate the role that Jewish Americans - past and present - have played in the larger story of the American people, and

WHEREAS, these observances offer an opportunity for all citizens to reflect upon the prejudice and persecution the Jewish people have faced throughout history; and

WHEREAS, antisemitism continues to rise across the world, it is imperative now more than ever we stand in solidarity with Israel and the Jewish community and fight against hate, religious bigotry, and terrorism across the nation and the globe, and

WHEREAS, we will not allow hate to disrupt the very principles that our great nation was founded upon - freedom, tolerance, and religious liberty, and

WHEREAS, as we celebrate our state's diversity, let us never forget our unwavering support for the State of Israel and its people, and may we always strive toward an even higher virtue - unity- by reinforcing ideas the values that transcend culture and ethnicity;

Honoring small Texas Jewish communities

Part 4: Historic Temple Emanuel in Beaumont is small but passionate

Temple Emanuel, a Reform synagogue located at 1120 Broadway in downtown Beaumont, was built 101 years ago and has 77 member-families

"We are a small Jewish community, but small does not describe the passion of our members and leadership," said Cynthia Wolf, Temple Emanuel president. "It is because of that passion we had a very successful second night Seder and, last December, we had so much fun with Chanukah celebrations with the city of Beaumont that all were welcomed to kindle Chanukah candles together.'

Temple Emanuel is the largest synagogue between Houston and Baton Rouge. Its members not only live in the Beaumont area (84 miles northeast of Houston), but also in eight other Southeast Texas communities. There also are members from the larger cities in Texas who have Beaumont roots and often come home for Jewish celebrations.

Every Friday, Temple Emanuel holds Shabbat services, followed by Torah study on Saturday (if guest Rabbis Mathew Michaels or Jon Nelson are in town). Congregants celebrate High Holy Days, as well as festivals like Purim, Sukkot, Simchat Torah and Chanukah.

In a region with a small Jewish community, yet a large faith community, interfaith relationships become very important.

"We have strong interfaith relationships with the various faiths of Southeast Texas," Wolf said. "A huge example of that support is a two-page spread, almost weekly, since Oct. 7, 2023, in The Examiner, by the owner, Wayne A. Reaud and/or editor Donald Dodd and local friends of the Jewish community. The content highlights Southeast Texas' commitment to 'Stand with Israel.'



Temple Emanuel in Beaumont was built more than 100 years ago and still has more than 75 members.

As part of Jewish American Heritage Month, the JHV has been highlighting four Jewish communities in cities located within

May 2 - Cong. Beth Shalom, Bryan

One of Temple Emanuel's annual traditions is participating in the charity "Tasting for Some Other Place" event. Some Other Place provides food throughout the year for people in need. Temple Emanuel volunteers

serve food on Christmas Day to SOP clients.

Temple Emanuel also holds an annual

Rabbi Samuel Rosinger Humanitarian Dinner, which honors the memory of the synagogue's late rabbi. Rabbi Rosinger, born in Hungary, who died in Beaumont at age 87, in 1965. Local humanitarians are honored, and a portion of the net proceeds are given to local nonprofits. Guest speakers visit Temple Emanuel for the event, and one of the most prominent was Rabbi Rick Jacobs, president of Union for Reform Judaism.

In October, Temple Emanuel will honor Lamar University with the Rabbi Samuel Rosinger Humanitarian Award. A portion of the event proceeds will be given toward a scholarship at the Beaumont-based university.

The Spindletop oil gusher changed the history and economics of Texas and the oil industry, in 1901. Temple Emanuel precedes that historic event by 14 years, as it was the





first synagogue in Beaumont in 1887, Some Temple Emanuel families trace their roots to the beginning of Jewish life in the Beaumont area, while others have relocated to Southeast Texas for their careers

Temple Emanuel dedicated its current building on Dec. 8, 1923, toward the end of Chanukah that year. The Bezalel Art School in Jerusalem (now the Bezalel Academy of Arts and Design) designed the copper-domed main sanctuary with stained-glass windows. The six stained-glass windows illustrate stories from Torah.

While the Beaumont Jewish community grew in the first half of the 20th century, it slowed down by the 1960s. Temple Emanuel and Kol Israel synagogue merged. By the 1970s, Temple Rodef Shalom, in nearby Port Arthur, merged with Temple Emanuel.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

What led to the merger of Kol Israel, a Conservative Congregation, with Temple Emanuel, a Reform Congregation and who served as Rabbis early on:

The Beaumont Jewish Community growth began to abate in the mid1960's. Many Community leaders, men and women who had helped to
mold and sustain the two congregations, were now gone. The baby
boom of the post-war years was over, reducing the number of students
in each of the two separate religious schools. Many native sons and
daughters of old Beaumont families chose to establish careers and
residence in other communities. Through a series of discussions and
deliberations, the memberships of Temple Emanuel and Kol Israel
agreed to merge the two congregations into one. The unification has
acted to strengthen the Beaumont Jewish Community. Now all Jewish children attend one religious school, and Temple members may
choose either Reform or Conservative modes of worship (at Temple
Emanuel in either the Main Sanctuary or the Kol Israel Chapel).

The first Rabbi of the newly unified congregation was Beno M. Wallach, who served this Community from 1970 to 1978. In 1978, Rabbi Norman Lipson entered the Community from a pulpit in Hattiesburg, Mississippi. He brought a youthful enthusiasm to the congregation.

This month's Guest Column is by Cynthia Wolf and begins with two questions that she hopes will provide you with the same wonderful memories that she has. But her real goal is to get you writing about yours:

Questions that might lead to some answers and that might turn into a future Guest Column by YOU:

Who remembers Sisterhood's Rummage Sales?

Who remembers Sisterhood's Pink Elephant Sales?

Michael and I moved to Beaumont the first time in 1972...two years into Rabbi Benno Wallach's time as Rabbi. And I packed a lot of volunteering and chairing into a very short time...and in October 1973, Natalie was born. Even when I was pregnant and a new mother, I chaired Sisterhood Style Shows and Fundraisers. We were in Beaumont from 1972 – May 1975.

But let me not get distracted, as I have two projects that I really want to talk about: Jerry Kessler (z"l) had been the chair of Sisterhood's Rummage Sale for many years, and I learned so much from her about pricing the items and selling them too and the true importance of The Rummage Sale.

When people came to shop, pricing was basically thrown out the basement window. When a person shopped, the process was to fill a brown grocery sack; and for \$5.00 a client could even buy a wedding dress...as it filled a bag. Or for \$5.00, a client could buy a bag of household items as well as shoes or wallets or purses. Or for \$5.00, a client could buy several men's suits and some ties.

It was a fundraiser because the many items to be sold cost Sisterhood nothing.

Yes, we made money; but what we really provided our clients at the Rummage Sale was DIGNITY! The Rummage Sale back then was its own social justice project.

And it was actually fun working in the basement with the other Sisterhood volunteers and with Ben Wheeler, long-time custodian of Temple Emanuel. Items had been primarily donated from Butch Hoffers, The Fair Store, Night's and The White House (all owned by Jewish merchants) and so many other stores and people's homes. So there were gently used items, but there were also many new items. The memories exist but the stores are all gone...and they and their owners has been important pieces of the fabric that defines the Jewish community of Beaumont and SETX.

Sometime prior to our moving away was the first Pink Elephant Sale. The clientele was different. We provided wine and cheese for the shoppers who were members of the community who supported all the non-profits and who were Friends of Temple Emanuel. It was held in Rosinger Center, as that is what the social hall was called back then. It was called a Pink Elephant Sale because all the items sold were new...coming from Butch Hoffers, The Fair Store, Gem Jewelry, Night's, and The White House (all owned by Jewish merchants) and so many other stores...including Johnson's Wholesale Florist. That was my last chair position, as Michael and I moved to Ft. Smith, AR May 1975...several months before Sallye was born.

I would love to learn your treasured memories of Sisterhood Style Shows or Sisterhood Rummage Sales or Sisterhood Pink Elephant Sales, so that...
