

Dear Congregational Family and Friends of Temple Emanuel,

As President of the Board of Trustees of Congregation Emanuel, what an honor it is to address those of you in the Main Sanctuary and those of you on Zoom during these High Holy Days...in particular tonight during *Erev Rosh Hashana* and tomorrow during *Rosh Hashana*.

This is *Erev Tishrei*...the evening before what is Jewishly the busiest month of the Jewish year...with *Rosh Hashana* and *Yom Kippur* and *Sukkot* and *Simchat Torah* and so much more! *Rosh Hashana* is the head of the Jewish year. *Tishrei* is the first month of the Jewish year.

And we are doing something important at Temple Emanuel each of the days of *Tishrei*. - And following Shabbat Services on Sukkot will be Sisterhood's Fall Feast...a meal eaten in the succah. THANK YOU, Sisterhood!!!!! There will be more information in the Weekly Happenings. Reservations are appreciatively required. Please call the Temple Office to let the amazing Sarah Pessink, our Administrative Office Manager, know your plans. Speaking of Sarah, for ALL that you have done in 5785 and how you have already begun 5786, THANK YOU!!!!!
- The very next weekend prior to *Shabbat*, will be *Yizkor*. And, included in *Shabbat* Services will be *Simchat Torah* and *Shemini Atzeret*.

But now, let's talk about tonight...*Erev Rosh Hashanah*...the last moments of the month of *Elul* during which we have been preparing for what will be the beginning of *Tishrei*...the beginning of the Jewish year... the first month of the Jewish calendar making it the first month of the Jewish year, for it marks the Birth of Humanity.

What was G-d anticipating as He waited? What were His thoughts?
